Please note that any Advanced Placement (AP), Cambridge (AICE), and Honors courses taken at Lemon Bay High School require a signed contract between the student, parent/guardian and school. Contracted Courses include all Honors, Cambridge AICE and Advanced Placement Courses.

By initialing and signing below, I understand and acknowledge the rigorous nature of Advanced Placement/AICE/Honors courses and state my intention to fully participate in college level/prep coursework.

_____1. Advanced Placement/AICE and Honors courses are significantly more rigorous than general classes and are designed to simulate the pace and content of a college class.

_____ 2. Advanced Placement/AICE and Honors courses require significant amount of study and reading time outside of the school day. One hour or more per night is not unusual to maintain adequate progress in the class.

______ 3. Advanced Placement/AICE and some Honors courses require summer assignments. These assignments are not optional and will be graded. Failure to complete these assignments will result in a poor or failing grade in Quarter 1. A student will not be moved out of the class due to not completing the summer assignment.

4. Class sections are limited in Advanced Placement/AICE and Honors courses. Not all students that apply will be registered. The final roster will be prepared by administration based on the following information: Overall GPA, grades in previous similar and prerequisite courses, attendance, and performance in previous AP classes and/or on previous AP tests. Furthermore, students participating in the associated courses will have preferential placement over students not participating.

5. Once enrolled in an Advanced Placement/AICE and Honors courses, students will be expected to finish the year in that course and take the Advanced Placement/AICE exam in the Spring. Schedule changes will only be made at natural breaks in school schedule i.e. end of marking periods. Such schedule changes remain at the discretion of administration and with the approval of a parent. Dropping an AP/AICE course in your senior year can effect college admissions. **Collegeboard (AP) now charges a \$40 fee to add or drop an AP Test after November 1**st.

6. Students in Advanced Placement and AICE classes are required to maintain a "C" semester average. Students failing to maintain a "C" semester average may be removed from the course at the end of the Fall semester and placed in an alternative course. Due to class size restrictions and the tight nature of the schedule, this may mean being scheduled into a general class or even an online version of the course as space permits.

_____7. Failure to take the Advanced Placement or AICE exam at the conclusion of a course will result in the loss of AP/AICE weighting and will be replaced with honors weighting. In addition, failure to sit for an Advanced Placement or AICE exam will result in a financial obligation for the cost of the exam
