- 1) I, _____, understand that plagiarism is equivalent to theft and fraud.

- 2) I have been educated about the meaning of plagiarism and understand the terms “direct quotation,” “paraphrase,” “summarize,” “source acknowledgment,” “attribution,” and “Works Cited.”

- 3) I know that copying words from print or **internet sources** without crediting the source constitutes plagiarism.

- 4) I understand that copying language generated by artificial intelligence, including ChatGPT, and presenting it as my own work is plagiarism.

- 5) I have learned ways to avoid plagiarism by always acknowledging the source of any **borrowed** passage, sentence, image, or key idea that I use in my own writing. I will put language copied from **any** source (including electronic sources) into quotation marks and acknowledge the author. If I paraphrase or summarize published language, I will give credit to the author, even if I change the words.

- 6) I will never present someone else’s work as my own, nor will I provide work for someone else.
